

EMERGENCY BROADBAND BENEFIT PROGRAM



WHAT IS IT?

The Emergency Broadband Benefit Program (EBBP) is a temporary emergency federal government benefit program to assist customers in the purchase of Internet access.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS?

The EBBP will provide a non-transferable, enhanced discount of up to \$75 for those living on qualifying Tribal lands, up to \$50 for those on non-Tribal lands. Limit one (1) discount per household.

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

A household is eligible if one member of the household has at least one of the following qualifications:

BROADBAND PACKAGES AVAILABLE (RESIDENTIAL ONLY)

Fiber

- 20/5 Mbps \$79.95
- 35/5 Mbps \$89.95
- 50/10 Mbps \$99.95

Fixed Wireless

- 5/1 Mbps \$59.95
- 10/2 Mbps \$69.95
- 15/3 Mbps \$79.95

HOW DO I SIGN UP?

- Qualifies for the Lifeline program, including those who are on Medicaid or receive SNAP benefits.
- Receives benefits under the free and reduced school breakfast or lunch program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision, or did so in the 2019-2020 school year.
- Experienced a substantial loss of income since February 29, 2020, and the household had a total income in 2020 below \$99,000 for single filers and \$198,000 for joint filers.
- Received a federal Pell Grant in the current year
- Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating providers existing low income or COVID-19 program.
